A NOTE FROM RABBI HOLTZ



VETERANS DAY

With November coming up, many people are perhaps focused on the upcoming Election Day. Elections, of course, matter. The decisions and leadership of our elected officials matter. Their policies and examples will impact people all over the world.

A little more than a week later, though, is Veterans Day. Veterans Day is a reminder that many more people than just officeholders have contributed to our country. We specifically remember those who served in our Armed Forces for their courage and sacrifices – they matter too. The words that Churchill said of the Royal Air Force during World War II, "Never was so much owed by so many to so few," could apply to many of our own heroes who fought and gave so much.

Thinking of our veterans and those still serving is also an invitation to think of the ways that many, many people serve our country. People give in all sorts of ways. For some, they choose a profession that specifically serves the community, and likely doesn't pay well in return. We think of the many firefighters, paramedics, police officers, teachers, social workers, and so on who sign up, often for little pay, because they want to give back and make better.

While we can and should be thankful to them, that is not the only way to contribute. Each of us can do a bit to make the lives of the people around us a little bit better. That might mean volunteering or contributing, it might mean peacefully protesting for a worthwhile cause, or it might mean remembering to treat others the way we wish to be treated.

The point is, as we are concerned about the well-being of our community and country, we can both acknowledge the importance of the roles that others play, while at the same time assuming a small bit of responsibility ourselves.

As Rabbi Tarfon said almost 2,000 years ago, "It is not up to you to do everything yourself, but you are not free to do nothing."

This November, with Election Day and Veterans Day, we are no doubt focused on how others impact our country. However, these days can also be reminders to us that we too can contribute – perhaps not in the same way or in as large a way, but in little, still meaningful ways.





Novels and Nosh Book Club


Sunday, November 15

News from the TKC President



In a few days, in the midst of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, Americans will elect a president, and vice president, 435-members of the House of Representatives, 35 Senators (including both from Georgia), 11 governors, and 86 state legislative chambers in 44 states. Like

paying taxes, serving on juries, and registering for the draft, voting is a civic duty critical to any democracy. Unlike other civic duties, however, voting in the United States is optional. Whatever the stakes, no law compels Americans to vote. So how should being Jewish shape your choice of whether or not to vote?

I believe that one of the greatest modern-day mitzvahs is voting. A mitzvah is something we are obligated to do. While none of us are required by law to vote, I believe we should feel obligated by our Jewish values. Voting is our opportunity to elect leaders who will help us to build the world that we pray about, learn about, and dream about in our Jewish tradition. Without voting, we give up our responsibility to help bring about this world.

Voting is a very Jewish thing. Tikkun Olam – the concept of repairing the world – can be practiced by anyone, anywhere, from doing an everyday mitzvah at home to encouraging policy change on an international scale. One of the ways to work on repairing the world, in order to create the kind of world you want to see, is to vote and be involved in your community, so that you are effecting change.

Judaism teaches us that voting is not just a civic duty. In fact, throughout Jewish history, many of our rabbis and sages have framed voting as a Jewish imperative. We are taught to choose life. Choosing life is a positive action, reminding us that we have to make choices to create the world we want to live in. Voting, in a democratic society, is such an example of making a choice.

It is via government that we Jews fulfill our civic duty to the communities where we live – not only by paying taxes, but also through public service and especially by voting.

Government's whole agenda – public health and safety, social policy, criminal justice, national security, environmental protection, and much more – are all concerns of Jewish voters. That is the Jewish commitment to our nation, our traditions, and our values – whatever our personal politics and partisanship may be.

Every election is important, and Judaism's value of collective action mandates Jews to pitch in. So if you have not already cast your vote early or mailed in you absentee ballot, please go to your assigned precinct this Tuesday (November 3) and vote! It is your duty as a Jew! I am thrilled to report that this year's High Holy Day Appeal was a fantastic success!

As of the October 18th deadline, we already received donations in excess of \$20,000, meaning we have maximized the anonymous matching \$20,000 challenge made by an incredibly generous anonymous TKC member. So in this year like no other, with no High Holy Day ticket sales or other traditional sources of holiday revenues, we are now assured that this year's Appeal generated over \$40,000 in much needed donations, thanks to the incredible generosity of at least 65 individual donors combined with the wonderful matching grant!

In addition, the High Holy Day cardboard cutouts fundraiser generated additional net funds in excess of \$2,900, and there were also other High Holy Day donations made to the Rabbi's Discretionary Fund.

So if you are one of these many donors to these campaigns, THANK YOU! Your generosity will help sustain *Temple Kehillat Chaim* during these difficult times, as we continue to lift the spirit, nurture the soul, and ensure the vibrancy of our kehillah in the years to come.

Here is some more exciting news! We will soon be launching a brand-new *Temple Kehillat Chaim* website, which has been in development over the last year. This important initiative has been spearheaded by my predecessor, Jonathan Young, our Immediate Past President. The new website has been artfully created by an incredibly generous TKC member, Jeff Pedowitz, and his talented web development team at The Pedowitz Group. This website will offer us a new look and feel, greatly enhanced functionality, and many other new features. So stay tuned!




