A Note From Rabbi Jason Holtz



Forty Years

Numbers have lots of meaning in Judaism. God is One, life, chaim, is eighteen, and forty too has lots of symbolism. Moses was forty years old when he fled Egypt to spend forty years shepherding a flock of sheep. He then heard from God out of a burning bush and returned to Egypt to free the Israelites. Moses and the Israelites then spent forty years traveling from slavery to freedom in the Promised Land. Moses spent forty days and nights on top of Mount Sinai-twice-to receive Torah from God. Whether it is forty days or forty years, the number forty is meant to signify that a period of time is transformative.

This year, Temple Kehillat Chaim is celebrating its fortieth anniversary. We had a wonderful gala last month and will continue to celebrate all year long. But it's more than just a number we're celebrating. We're celebrating forty years of transformative community. Our name, Kehillat Chaim, a community of life, is an appropriate name for us. Being a part of our Jewish community can uplift our lives. Together, we learn, we share special moments, we build and deepen friendships, and more.

But while the number forty has special symbolic value, it's not magic. We're not just celebrating the time that our congregation has existed, but we are also celebrating all that people have done to make this place special. Rabbi Winokur, Alan Abrams, numerous lay leaders and volunteers, staff members, community members, and more poured their time and energy into this place to help make it what it is. As we celebrate forty years from 1982-2022, let us learn from their example, and commit to making TKC special in the next forty years as well.

News from the TKC Office

We are delighted to have Amy Deich join our staff as the Administrative Director.

Amy (Rossman) Deich grew up in Wayland, MA, as part of a founding family at Temple Shir Tikva, a Reform synagogue. She was very involved in all

areas of synagogue life and became an active participant in the temple youth group (STIFTY, which was part of NEFTY at that time) during High School. Amy attended Union College in Schenectady, NY where she received her B.S. in Psychology in 1998, and later received her M.A. in Child Development from Tufts University in Somerville, MA. Amy worked in the Boston area for a number of years in child development and early intervention, before moving to San Diego, CA. While in San Diego, she worked with children and adults with developmental disabilities at the county's Regional Center. In 2006, Amy and her husband Sam moved to Roswell, GA and she began working as a Family Support Coordinator at Sheltering Arms Child Development Center in Chamblee. Amy worked there for 3 1/2 years before becoming a full time stay at home mother to her two daughters, which also allowed her time to volunteer within the community.

Amy and Sam spent their first few years in GA looking for a Jewish home, and after attending High Holiday Tot services with Caroline & Danny, they knew Temple Kehillat Chaim was the right place for their family. Both daughters, Emily and Talia, attended preschool at TKC, and Amy coordinated the Tot Shabbat monthly program. Amy later served on the Board of Trustees, Education Committee and the Rabbi search committees. The Deich Family moved to Plano, TX from 2018-2021 where they were members of Temple Shalom in Dallas, but then returned to Roswell and their community at TKC.

Amy continues to volunteer with her kids' schools through PTA and other organizations. She spends much of her time driving her daughters to and from rehearsals and performances for their various theater programs, but also can be found happily reading on their screened in porch with an iced coffee in hand.

News from TKC President Alan Abrams



Stronger Than Ever

It is with mixed emotions that I am writing this last monthly message to you as TKC's president. I am a bit sad that my second opportunity to serve as president is ending, but I'm also very proud of all we've accomplished in the last two years.

When my current term began in April 2020, the pandemic was just beginning. It was a particularly critical time for our congregation, because of the uncertainties of what the pandemic would bring, combined with concerns about our temple's ability to withstand the financial challenges that we might face during the uncertain times ahead.

Temple leadership had already made the decision to temporary suspend in person services or other functions in the building and move everything online. I figured that status might continue for several months based on the best scientific projections at the time. Of course that was a drastic underestimate!

Nevertheless, now at the end of my second term as your president, I am very proud that TKC has not only survived the last two years, but I believe we're stronger than ever, thanks to so many of you who have contributed your wisdom, love and financial support.

We persevered through perhaps the toughest two years in our long history. We overcame incredible obstacles because so many of you stepped up in so many important ways. Those of you who were able to make donations to help bridge the gap were essential in our strengthened financial position. Those who chaired committees and served on the board, and many more of you who joined with them in activities on Zoom, helped our physical distance to feel somewhat less than it actually was. Throughout we stayed connected and we remained a kehillah.

Thanks to the generosity of so many of our members, we are emerging from the dark days of the pandemic

much stronger financially there any point in recent years. Our High Holy Day and year-end appeals in 2020 and 2021 were two of the most successful in TKC's history. In addition, we have created an endowment fund to help protect TKC's financial position for future generations.

Even though the pandemic turned everything upside down, we still kept our sacred community alive and thriving. I believe the spirit of our kehillah remains as strong as ever. It was wonderful to celebrate our 40th anniversary with many of you a couple of weeks ago. It has been a long time since we could all be together and without masks and without fear. I think it was one of the best parties we've had in a long time!

And not only was it a lot of fun, but it was a successful fundraiser as well. It was just another example of the resilience of our temple.

I have been honored to serve as our temple's president during these turbulent and unprecedented times. As we continue to celebrate our 40th year as a congregation, it's very important that each and every one of us continue to find ways we can help the kehillah and influence our future in a positive way. I believe the most important dynamics of our kehillah are actually very much the same today as they were we began 40 years ago. I see the same spirit of community and fellowship, clearly demonstrating how wonderful and supportive our kehillah still is today.

It has been a true blessing for me to have the opportunity once again to help lead our sacred community. I am very proud of what TKC is today, and I am incredibly excited about our future!

And now I get to re-join an exclusive group I created in 1985 – TKC's Past President's club!




