The Decree of Heaven: Our Response

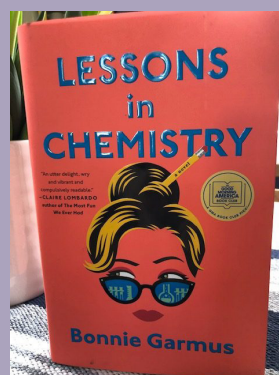
*On Rosh Hashanah it is written,
and on Yom Kippur it is sealed...
but teshuvah, tefillah, and tzedakah
pass the evil of the decree.*

Sometimes, it seems like we can predict the future. School will start in September, your favorite team will have another winning (or losing) season, just as everyone predicted, and things will get more and more expensive. Some people who are healthy right now will not be so next year, and some people who are here with us this now will not be here next year, despite anyone's best efforts. We say, "On Rosh Hashanah it is written, and on Yom Kippur it is sealed..." Some people believe this *piyyut*, liturgical poem, literally; God ordains the future. Many, however, do not believe that God has either the power, the desire, or both to shape the exact course of everyone's

life. Whatever one believes, though, things will happen that are outside of our control. Despite that, we affirm that "*teshuvah* (repentance), *tefillah* (prayer), and *tzedakah* (righteous giving) pass the evil of the decree." Things will happen that are outside of our control, but we can always respond. Sometimes, it is how we respond to the events in our lives and the events in others' lives that is as important or even more important than the event itself. Viktor Frankl, a Holocaust survivor as well as a neurologist and psychiatrist wrote, "Everything can be taken from a man or a woman but one thing: the last of human freedoms to choose one's attitude in any given set of circumstances, to choose one's own way." That can make all the difference. The decree, the things that we cannot control for whatever reason, will happen — yet we are not powerless. Whether we think we have it all or we believe we have lost it all, our lives and our world can always be improved through *teshuvah*, *tefillah* and *tzedakah* - repentance, prayer, and righteous giving.

News from TKC President Seth Litman



High Holiday Memories

One of the things I find most enjoyable about being on the Temple Board is the opportunity meet and get to know people I either didn't know or didn't know well. At the end of each meeting, I ask each member of the Board to share with the others an answer to question which most of the time relates to their Jewish upbringing and Jewish life. What is your favorite holiday and why? What is your favorite Jewish family moment? Tell us about your Jewish life growing up.

This past month I asked the Board to describe their favorite High Holiday memory. I was struck that most of the Board members' memories had little to do with the holiday, but instead were memories of gatherings with family and friends to celebrate the holidays, relationships forged at TKC or their childhood synagogue, and funny stories of fasting at Yom Kippur. I shared mine as well. Growing up attending a Conservative Synagogue, there was very little that was fun about the long, sometimes

tedious, services. This was especially so on Yom Kippur when the fast seemed never ending. But there was one thing about our services that most Temple Beth El's members did not miss – the Rock and Roll Kaddish. It was a moment of service transition (not the mourner's kaddish obviously) where our very talented Cantor and the choir sang a very exciting, upbeat version of an otherwise pedestrian prayer. Just as memorable as the prayer were Rabbi Kessler's one-liners that always followed because he knew that hearing that prayer was the highlight of the day for many of the hundreds of congregants there that day. "Scintillating," "awesome," "breathtaking" were just some of his comments that put a smile on congregants agreeing faces.

What are your favorite High Holiday memories? Is it the family and/or friend dinner? Was there a moment during a Kehillat Chaim service that you remember? Just as importantly, what will you and your children remember about celebrating the High Holidays together?

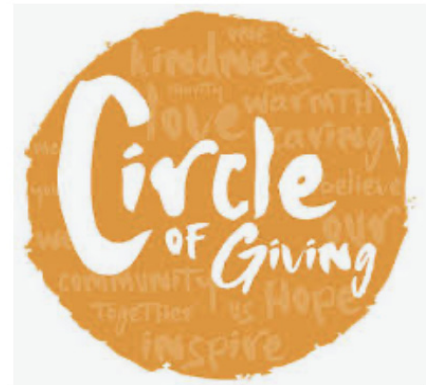

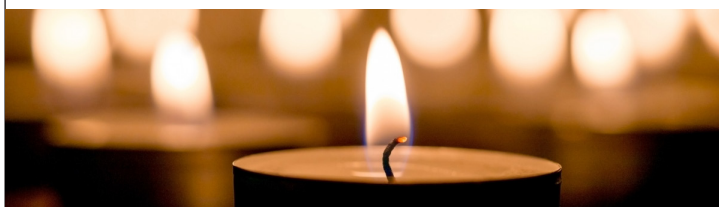

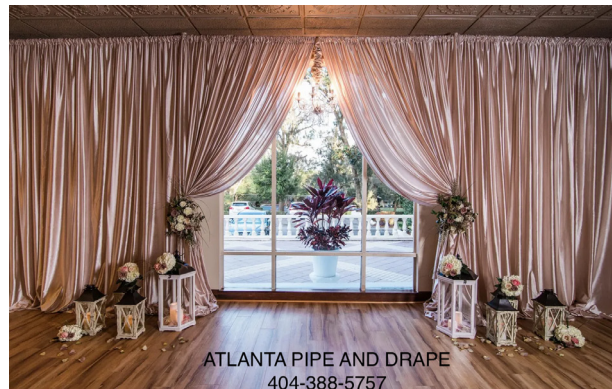
