## A Note From the Rabbi

## Sukkot

Once, the day before Sukkot, there was a man who built a sukkah on his property. I think it was the same guy I spoke about on Rosh Hashanah, Shmerel. Anyways, Shmerel's neighbors really didn't like his sukkah, and worse, they had city zoning ordinances on their side. They filed a complaint. Shmerel was worried, what was he going to do if he had to take down his sukkah? How could he celebrate the holiday? The case went to Judge Solomon, who upon seeing the complaint, scolded Shmerel, saying, "Shmerel! You can't just build anything you want, even if it is on your property. I'm giving you one week to have it removed!" Perfect! The punchline, of course, is that Sukkot only lasts a week, so no problem.

A sukkah, by definition, is a temporary structure. If it's designed to be left up, it's not a sukkah. We build the Sukkah, spend time in it for a week, and then take it down. Even the nicest sukkot, by law and tradition, needs to look

temporary. They don't have four complete walls, stars have to be visible through the roof, and well...you get the idea.

One lesson for the holiday is that everything, except for the Eternal, is temporary. We have old folk phrases like "this too shall pass." One Sukkot tradition is to read from the Book of Ecclesiastes which says, "To everything there is a season... a time for this and a time for that...". We read it to drive home the message, that everything has a time—a limited, finite time. Sukkot, an agricultural festival, teaches that every season comes and then it goes.

Sometimes that message can't help but make us feel nostalgic for the past. At the same time, it can also make us hopeful for a better future. There's more to it than that, though. Sukkot is a joyous holiday, where we celebrate whatever abundance we happen to have. Yes, our present may be temporary. Maybe we had previous harvests that were better, maybe we're looking forward to better days ahead, but even if that's how we feel, we give thanks for what we have right now. It's no wonder that the holiday of Thanksgiving was based off our festival of Sukkot.

May this Sukkot be one of abundance, blessing, and gratitude for you and for everyone.

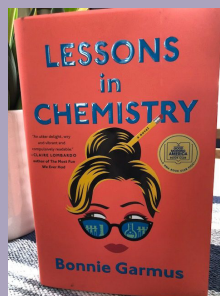

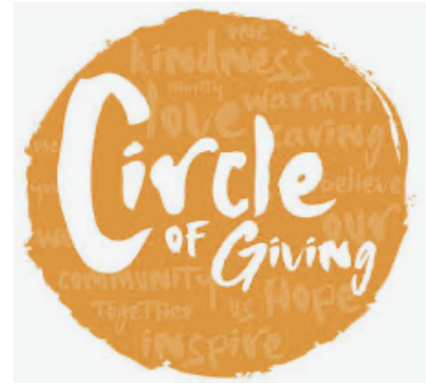

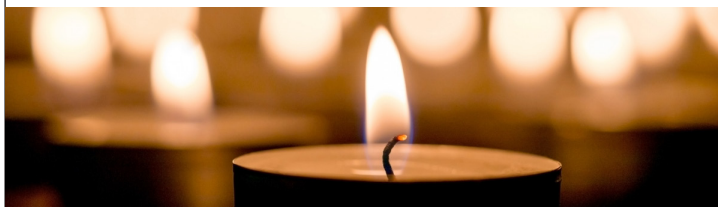
