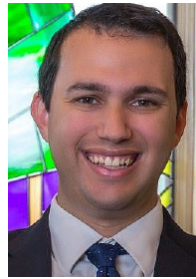

A Note From the Rabbi

A Troubling Trend

Jew-hatred, AKA Antisemitism, is on the rise. There were several high-profile examples last month. Kanye West, musician and former sneaker mogul, went public with his hatred by tweeting that he was going “death con 3” on Jewish people to his 32 million followers, which is about 25 million more people than there are Jews in America. Basketball star Kyrie Irving promoted an anti-Jewish, conspiracy theory filled film on Instagram. At \$40 a copy, it instantly became the #1 best-seller on Amazon in the Religion and Spirituality category. After all of this, Dave Chapelle, comedian extraordinaire and no stranger to controversy, took one the biggest stages in America, Saturday Night Live, and addressed these issues – not by condemning Jew-hatred, but making light of it and suggesting there may be some truth to it. The cherry on top was when former President Trump hosted Kanye West and three of his guests, including Holocaust-denier Nick Fuentes at Mar-a-Lago. President Trump claims he didn’t know who Nick Fuentes was – OK – but he knows Kanye West, and none of them should have the apparent endorsement of dining with the former President.

The problem with all of these anti-Jewish words and actions from celebrities is that they normalize Jew-hatred for many people. Millions and millions of people follow them and trust them, not because they make logical arguments but because people like them and want to be like them. Social media has a very good term for people with lots of followers – they’re called influencers. These people making either blatant anti-Jewish statements, or even simply smiling and winking at Jew-hatred, are setting a poor example that is being followed. The FBI, which keeps statistics on hate crimes, notes that Jews are by far the largest victims of religiously-motivated hate crimes in America and that it is getting worse. FBI Director

Christopher Wray recently testified before Congress that “Antisemitism and violence that comes out of it is a persistent and present fact,” and that 63 percent of religious hate crimes were antisemitic, even though it’s “targeting a group that makes up about 2.4% of the American population.” These crimes range from vandalism of synagogues and Jewish cemeteries to swastikas spray-painted in public schools – with several local examples at places like Pope High School and Centennial High School – to assault, to hostage taking at a synagogue in Texas and mass shootings at Tree of Life Synagogue and Chabad of Poway, California.

So, what can we do about all of this? The first is not to minimize, ignore, or appease. Problems very rarely go away on their own, they need to be solved. The second is to recognize that the goal of Jew-haters is to make Jews and Judaism go away. So long as we’re here, proudly Jewish, they’ll never succeed. Furthermore, as Jews, we’re the counterpoint to Jew-haters. When Jews are public and proud about their Jewish-identity, we can be positive examples in our community. We don’t do good to give Jews a good name, but it is a nice bonus. We help out at Drake House, and Pleasant Hill Baptist Church, and lots of other places. Motivated by our Jewish tradition, we do this because it is a mitzvah, the right thing to do. Yet, by doing so publicly as a Jewish community, we contribute to our people having a good name. Third, it’s good to have friends. The Jewish community can never solve Jew-hatred on its own. Whether it is companies like Adidas, political leaders, or other influencers, we need it to be made clear that Jew-hatred won’t be tolerated and that good people and good organizations don’t associate with or partner with Jew-haters. Fourth, and finally, bigots rarely have just one bigotry. White supremacists like neither Jews nor Black people. The fight against bigotry is wide-ranging, and even when Jews aren’t directly targeted, we must constantly work towards the Torah’s ideals, “Love the stranger as yourself for you were strangers in the land of Egypt,” and “Love your neighbor as yourself.” May those ideals be realized soon by all.
