A Note From the Rabbi



A TIME FOR RENEWAL

In late November, Rabbi Moshe Druin, a *sofer*, a scribe, visited TKC to work on maintaining and restoring our Torah scrolls. As he examined our Holocaust Memorial Scroll from Bzenec, which was written way back in 1780, he remarked on how it is aging beautifully and with a little bit of work, would be fit for regular use.

To be perfectly honest, I was a little surprised. Torah scrolls can hold up well for a long time, but this particular one is 240 years old! It's older than the United States Constitution. It's one of the few surviving remnants of its original Jewish community.

Through us, the scroll has new life and continues to teach the stories and values that it had for hundreds of years. That, in and of itself, is special. However, with the *sofer's* reassurance of its continuing durability, I intend to use it regularly. It now sits in our ark not on the top shelf – where it is hard to reach but easy to admire – but now down below, easily within the grasp of anyone, ready to continue its service.

As the *sofer* was hard at work, I thought of Chanukkah. Chanukkah is a holiday of renewal. The story talks about a dark time, when the Greek Seleucids attempted to extinguish Jewish life. The Maccabees fought back, and the Menorah they lit in the Temple gave off just a small amount of light, but it was enough to kindle the hope for a brighter future.

Our Torah scrolls – in particular the Holocaust Memorial Scroll – are in some ways like that Menorah. They offer their own sort of illumination, as well as hope for restoration and renewal.

As we finish 2020, we're all in need of a bit of renewal. This has been a hard year. Chanukkah and our beautiful, long-lasting Torah scrolls can be a bit of inspiration and reassurance. And when we can finally – and hopefully soon – come together again, like the Maccabees of old, we can formally rededicate our community. *Chadeish yameinu k'kedem* – God, renew our days as old!





News from the TKC President



For the task is too heavy for you; you cannot do it alone...You shall also seek out from among all the people those who are capable and who fear God... Let them share the burden with you.

Exodus 18:18; 21-22

It is that time of year again. Over the next few months, TKC's Nominating Committee led by our Immediate Past President, Jonathan Young, will be compiling the slate of nominees to serve as the lay leaders of our kehillah in 2021-2022 and beyond. If you have ever considered the possibility of one day joining our temple's leadership team, now is a great time for you to learn more and explore the many ways that you might help guide our congregation in the coming years. At our annual meeting of members in April, we will be electing our next team of officers and trustees. Will your name be on the list?

Becoming an officer, trustee or committee chair offers a marvelous opportunity for you to help guide and develop the programmatic and spiritual direction of our temple. You can help us continue to improve the ways and means by which TKC adheres to the great principles and ideals of our Jewish people in order to be a community of vision, one that truly represents a center of religious living and religious action, striving to secure lifelong learning opportunities through the study of Torah and the texts of our faith.

In addition to being an honor, the responsibility of being a leader of our kehillah represents a critical and sacred trust. The new leadership team will be called upon to deal with financial and business aspects of the congregation, continuing our ongoing efforts to secure the financial and spiritual future of Temple Kehillat Chaim for generations yet to come. As one of the leaders of our synagogue, you can help set an example for your fellow congregants by your participation in our educational, cultural and worship programs and services.

As the pandemic continues, TKC faces great challenges. No one can say with certainty what the long-term effects may be, but I am confident that our kehillah will persevere and continue to thrive. There is no doubt, however, that keeping any damage from the pandemic to a minimum will require our leaders to be innovative and to think outside of the box. Many traditional educational, spiritual and fundraising events, for example, may have to be reimagined.

In the aftermath of this crisis, there will be an opportunity to create a new paradigm of congregational life and service. At present, our leaders are focusing on pandemic protocols and reopening strategies. While there still will be plenty of pandemic-related decisions to be made in the coming months, I believe that by springtime, our new leadership team will be able to begin to focus more on how to navigate the future, to envision and prepare for a new congregational paradigm in the aftermath of COVID-19.

If you are considering being more involved in temple leadership, but you are hesitant because you fear you may lack the specific knowledge and experience needed to be successful, don't worry! The Union for Reform Judaism (URJ) recently launched a number of new short online courses that are available to TKC members, which cover the various aspects of synagogue life. These courses are asynchronous, meaning you can select the courses you are most interested in, and then start and move through them at your own pace. These courses use a variety of modalities, including videos and blog posts, and you can even test your knowledge with a quiz at the end of each unit.

These lessons include units for experienced leaders looking to refine their skills, as well as units focused on building basic foundational skills for new potential congregational leaders. The "Emerging Leaders" resources include an implementation guide and 11 modules, all developed through the lens of Jewish texts and values. The topics covered are:

- Introduction to congregational leadership
- Learning about your congregational community
- Congregational mission, vision, and values
- •Reform Judaism
- •Personal leadership style
- Leadership skill
- •Congregational governance
- •Financial responsibility of congregational leaders
- •Being a congregational ambassador
- Goal setting
- Social justice

Other online courses from the URJ available for TKC members looking to acquire new skills or enhance and sharpen their existing skills include financial, leadership and governance training.

Whether you are considering the possibility of being a part of TKC leadership for the first time, or you are a past leader wishing to get more involved once again, or you have suggestions about other members for potential leadership roles, or you just simply want to learn more about the possibilities, please let Jonathan Young, Rabbi Holtz or me know.

Speaking from my own personal experience, being involved in the leadership of our kehillah has been among the most profound and rewarding endeavors of my life. As many of you know, I have been active in TKC leadership off and on for all 39 years of our synagogue's existence, and each time has been among my favorite highlights. And after all these years, the privilege I currently enjoy of once again serving as our temple president may top them all!

So I urge you to consider giving yourself a similar life-changing reward!






