### Let's Dedicate This Chanukkah to TKC

Chanukkah is an enjoyable time, hopefully filled with good food, beautiful lights, and people that we care about. Chanukkah literally means dedication, but it's actually about the rededication of the ancient Temple in Jerusalem. The Temple was captured by the Greek Seleucids, but the Maccabees were able to reclaim and rededicate it – Chanukkah. This year especially though, it's taken on new significance and importance at TKC for two very important reasons.

First, while TKC never closed during the pandemic, there was a lot we either couldn't do or had to do differently. We missed out on a lot, most especially many opportunities to be with one another in person. While we've had many in-person opportunities for a while now, we've not been back to where we were. Starting soon and nearly coinciding with Chanukkah, we'll be

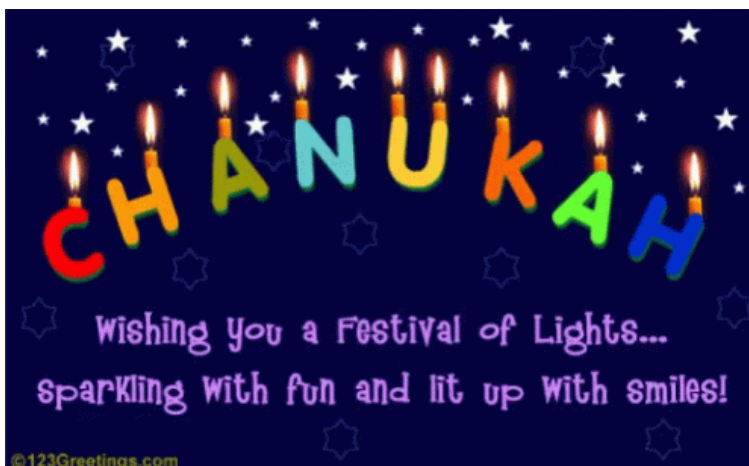

## News from TKC President Alan Abrams



### Chanukkah Has Arrived!

Our annual festival of lights originally was intended to be a private celebration at home, but today Chanukkah menorahs are often displayed in windows for those passing by to enjoy. As the light grows with each night, we commemorate the legend of the single cruse of oil that lasted eight nights. We traditionally eat foods fried in oil such as latkes, and due to the influence of other December holidays, it has also become the main gift-giving holiday for Jews in North America.

Because Chanukkah does not originate in the Bible, it is considered a minor festival. While Jews often gather for parties and public candle lightings, it is perfectly acceptable (although this year maybe not preferable!) to celebrate only with those in your household.

The word Chanukkah comes from the Hebrew word for dedication, and it is derived from the Maccabees' rededication of the Temple in Jerusalem. The moral of the Chanukkah story is to remind us that faith and hope can sometimes be more powerful than physical strength.

This year, I encourage you to see Chanukkah as an opportunity to help bring light into the world however you can, perhaps by donating to our kehillah. Although TKC continues to reopen from the darkest days of the pandemic, some of us may still feel physically restricted. All of us, however, are still blessed with the religious freedom to celebrate, and those of us who have the resources to give can bring even more light to our world!

So I respectfully ask those of you who are able to please consider a year-end contribution to our temple. Any donation no matter the amount will be greatly appreciated and will help strengthen TKC as we prepare for 2022 and beyond. Please remember that your year-end donation, as well as other payments such as dues, M&M, etc. made to TKC before December 31st, are tax-deductible.

Let us remember the importance of the blessings we say on the first night of Chanukkah as we light the lone candle. In addition to thanking God for enabling us to fulfill the mitzvah of kindling the holiday lights, we thank God for helping us to reach this season, and for the great miracle that took place for our ancestors.

No matter what challenges each of us may face in the world right now, we still can thank God for what we have – including the blessing of each new day and the hope for a brighter tomorrow.

This is also the season that we begin considering who will be our lay leaders in the coming year. Over the next few months, TKC's Nominating Committee, this year led by Erica Goodwin, will be compiling the slate of nominees to serve as the leaders of our kehillah as we celebrate our temple's 40th anniversary.

If you have ever considered the possibility of one day joining our temple's leadership team, now is a great time for you to learn more and explore the many ways that you might help guide our congregation in the coming year. At our annual meeting of members in April, we will be electing our next team of officers and trustees. Will your name be on the list?

Becoming an officer, trustee or committee chair offers a marvelous opportunity for you to help guide and develop the programmatic and spiritual direction of our temple. You can help us continue to improve the ways and means by which TKC adheres to the great principles and ideals of our Jewish people.

In addition to being an honor, the responsibility of being a leader of our kehillah represents a critical and sacred trust. As one of our leaders, you can help set an example for your fellow congregants by your participation in our educational, cultural and worship programs and services.

Whether you are considering the possibility of being a part of TKC leadership for the first time, or you are a past leader wishing to get more involved once again, or you have suggestions about other members for potential leadership roles, or you just simply want to learn more about the possibilities, please let Erica Goodwin, Rabbi Holtz or me know.

Speaking from my own personal experience, being involved in the leadership of our kehillah has been among the most profound and rewarding endeavors of my life. So I urge you to consider giving yourself a similar life-changing reward!

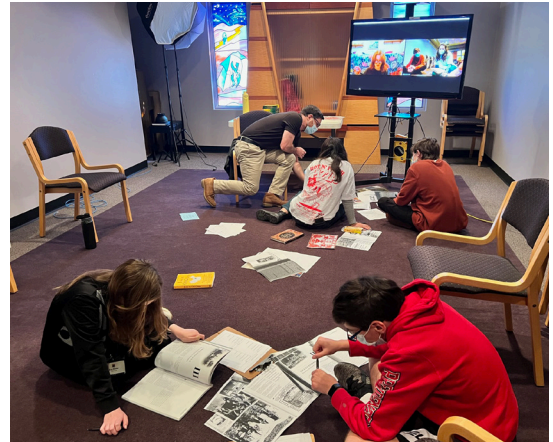




## Religious School Update

November was a short but busy month at the Mitzner Family Religious School!

This month we hosted our second Chai 5 session with our 8th – 10th graders, focused on Jews around the world. This session took our students to China, where Jews aren't plentiful but still have a presence. They traced the Jewish heritage in China and then indulged in some Chinese food – including unique spices and flavors only found there. Our Shinshin, Alma, was present to explore the topic with us, after leading a fun and engaging Hebrew class with our 4th – 6th graders on her life in Israel and her home city of Yokneam. Also, our 7th graders were welcomed back into the building for the first time this school year to partake in a family education day with Rabbi Holtz. The session was focused on tzedakah as he introduced the families to our Tzedakah in Action program. Tzedakah in Action was started many years ago as a donation program by B'nai Mitzvah families to a 7th grade class tzedakah fund that the 7th graders then use to help a charity of their choosing. This year's group will decide in January where they would like to donate their funds!

Finally, we started a new program at MFRS called the Mensch House. The Mensch House is the little-known 5th house of Harry Potter, focused on those who do good deeds. The students earn certificates of acknowledgment and prizes on an individual and class level. This past week, we had our first two classes receive their popsicle parties for their Mensch House work – in the areas of **KAVOD**, respect for their classmates and teacher; **TIKKUN OLAM**, taking care of the world through cleaning their classrooms before they leave; and **RUACH**, participation and spirit! Congrats to our 2nd and 4th grade classes for working hard week after week to receive your prize!



Now we gear up for Chanukkah with our Chanukkah trivia event on Sunday, December 5th! I wish you all a safe and happy Chanukkah, with the light of the chanukiah lighting your lives the way the students and staff of MFRS light mine. I am so honored to be leading our great religious school this year – thank you for your continued trust in me.



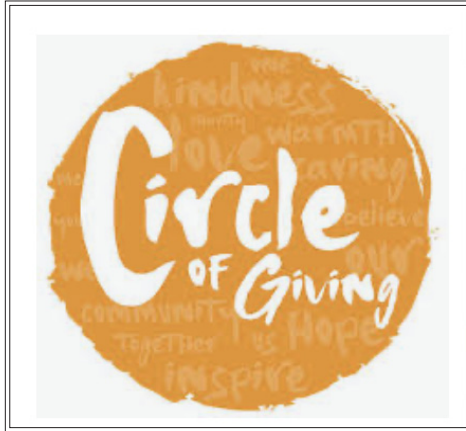
