A Note From the Rabbi



Love the Stranger

Antisemitism reared its ugly head again last month, first at Pope High School and then at Lassiter High School when Nazi imagery appeared on their walls. Even more disconcerting was that the school leadership failed to recognize and name it for what it was, antisemitism. It's hard to see this as an isolated incident. Sadly, minority groups, including minority faiths, are often targeted as a result of either ignorance, fear, or hatred. In response to that reality, the Anti-Defamation League formerly provided Cobb County Schools with educational resources called "No Place for Hate." Recently, though, the program was discontinued in response to a resolution from the school board banning critical race theory in schools. The problem with removing educational resources means that both students and even adults are unprepared or unable to address issues around diversity, making incidents such as what happened recently more likely and unsurprising.

At recent school board meetings, Jewish students and parents, as well as communal leaders, spoke to problems Jewish students are facing at school. Following the school board meetings, there was a smaller group meeting with representatives of the Jewish community. Some progress has been made. First, Georgia's State Commission on the Holocaust will provide professional development to staff in the schools. The school board will arrange for substitute teachers to cover classes to enable teacher attendance. Second, while attendance rules have changed during the pandemic, the school board agreed that Jewish (and other minority faith) students will no longer be penalized in any way for absences because of religious holidays. Specifically, this means Jewish students will still be eligible for perfect attendance awards (if the awards return) should a Jewish student be absent for a Jewish holiday. Holiday absences will not be marked "excused" or "unexcused," but simply, "holiday." Third, we expect continuing attention to the issue as time goes on.

To me, this is just the latest example of something that happens to a greater or lesser extent all the time. One person or a group of people acts in a hostile way towards another person or group of people because of their identity, be it race, religion, the language someone speaks, or some other differing attribute. In our Torah, we read about how Pharaoh was afraid of the Hebrews and used that as justification to enslave them. We read about Haman who was insulted by Mordechai because he refused to bow down to him and used that as justification to attempt genocide. There are smaller acts of aggression though, including insults, vandalism, or bullying. Our tradition is very clear though; such things are completely forbidden. This time, the act was antisemitic and against Jews, next time it might be some other target. In all cases, it is an act of hostility towards people who are different. As Jews, we have a responsibility to do what we can to stand up to prejudices and hatreds. Rather than hate those who are different, we are commanded to "Love the stranger, love people who are different from you, for you were strangers in the land of Egypt." Love of course isn't just a warm and fuzzy feeling, it is a prescription for how we are to behave or not behave. May we always work to move closer towards our ideals, and may our community be a welcoming, loving place for all its residents.




